# Hope through a Holistic Approach

Amid challenges in Haiti in 2022, hope was experienced by thousands of our Haitian brothers and sisters through the impact of Haiti Outreach Ministries. We are grateful for God's faithfulness and the generosity of friends like you which made this impact possible.

Our vision is to develop **self-sustaining communities** that help people become the individuals God intended them to be. We achieve this through programs that address the spiritual, mental, physical, and economic needs of our Haitian brothers and sisters.

## PROGRAMMATIC IMPACT

### HEALTH CARE

**13,513 PATIENTS** received essential medical and dental care as well as life-saving education. **2,100 HOUSEHOLDS** received cholera prevention kits.



### CLEAN WATER & NUTRITION

**511,000 GALLONS** of clean, safe drinking water provided to community members. **3,100 INDIVIDUALS** benefitted from emergency food assistance.



### SPIRITUAL CARE

**3,500 INDIVIDUALS** received God's Word through weekly worship services and Sunday school classes.



### ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT

**511 STUDENTS** successfully completed vocational classes in sewing, tailoring, information technology, and masonry.



### EDUCATION

**2,122 STUDENTS** enrolled in four schools and local universities. Over **1,600 US SPONSORS** made education possible for these students.





# ECONOMIC IMPACT

In 2022, HOM conducted four major construction projects. This included: adding a kitchen, classrooms, and computer lab to the Baryè Fè secondary school, constructing essential buildings and amenities on the Espwa Campus, advancing the Youth Building on the Repatriote Campus, and improving offices and infrastructure on the Terre Noire Campus. **100% of purchasing was done in Haiti, creating economic impact in the following ways:**

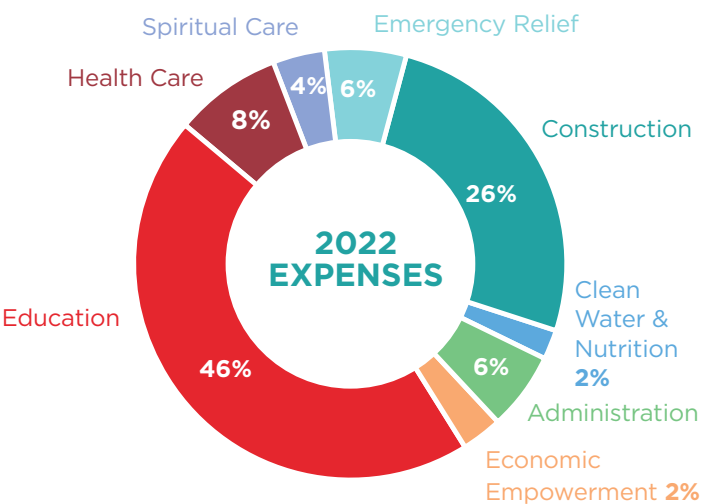
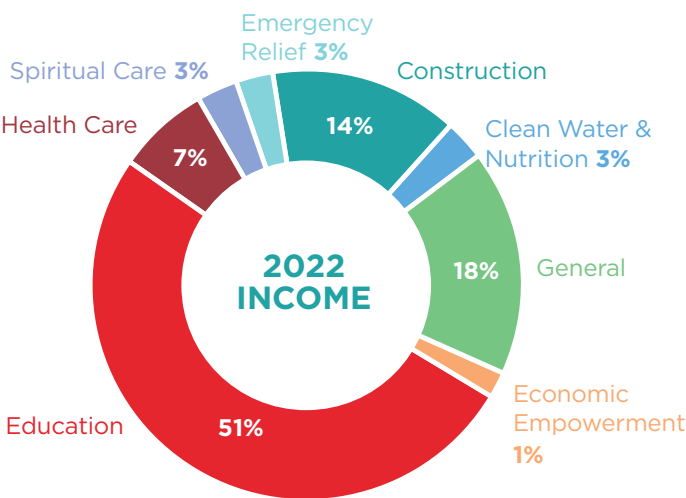

## INDIVIDUAL IMPACT: ONE STUDENT'S STORY

**In 1990, Dr. Benouchea Pierre was a student in the very first class at the Cité Soleil primary school. Today she is the Chief of the Intensive Care Unit at Mirebalais University Hospital in Haiti.** While her primary school days are long behind her, Dr. Pierre says she fondly remembers how “the school was like a family” and its emphasis on both knowledge and strong values, recalling “I learned things that other kids didn’t.” The solid educational foundation she received at the Cité Soleil school paved the way for entry into a competitive local high school, medical studies at Notre Dame University, and a prestigious fellowship in France, training in anesthesiology and critical care. Dr. Pierre is one of only two intensivists (critical care doctors) in Haiti. She could be working anywhere but is committed to serving her country.
